This will appear on the Program Administrator's U.S. Center for SafeSport account page 30 days after the TRAINED course is completed. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) All Program Administrators must take the TRAINED course. 2) Program Administrators that require team rostering must have the appropriate minimum training certificate verified on their profile prior to: Team Rostering, Team Activation, and card printing. 3) SafeSport certificates are valid for 11 months upon the upload date. On June 1, 2020 the system will un-verify and delete certificates uploaded 11 months or longer ago. Cal South will provide the Club/League and individual's that will have certificates un-verified and deleted.
